Where we Live, Work, Play Learn and Worship

200,000 Certified Wildlife Habitats and 500,000 engaged gardeners include:

175,000 places of residence, 7,000 farms and ranches, 7,000 schools, 1,000 places of worship, in addition to community gardens, nature centers, zoos, aquariums and arboretums, and many thousands of acres of public parks.

1.4 million school children and 40,000 educators participate via our Schoolyard Habitats and Eco-Schools programs.

143 Community Wildlife Habitats to create corridors of habitat gardens in central migratory flyways for monarchs and other wildlife.

1000 plus trained habitat steward volunteers.





NWF's Direct Monarch Recovery Efforts

1. Monarch Habitat Enhancement – Urban Outreach along Central Flyway –NFWF

- <u>Build capacity</u> within flyway cities and towns to take action on behalf of monarchs. Coordinated from Austin, Great Lakes, -includes Mayors' Monarch Pledge across 8-10 key cities from 14 states along flyway.
- Support milkweed planting and maintenance to contribute to monarch-population increase from 225 million to 500 million in the central flyway.
- State monarch conservation plan support through key affiliates and regional offices in Missouri, Texas and other states and in partnership with Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies.



NWF's Direct Monarch Recovery Efforts

2. MOU with US Fish and Wildlife Service

Coordinating with the following to identify opportunities along the I-35 corridor for milkweed/pollinator plantings and designation of Monarch Highway.

- State highway departments of transportation,
- White House Office of Science, Technology and Policy,
- The U.S. Department of Transportation

3. Large Landscape Efforts

- CRP and other conservation lands
- Working with Farmers to re-establish milkweed on field borders, etc.
- Grasslands coalition and Sodsaver
